


Storm of March 1966, Field shed blown in David and Dennis Harrison.


1966 snow storm, Henderson Hwy.

PATRIOTIC EXERCISES

(Prescribed by the Advisory Board of the Department of Education)

WHEREAS Section 17 (1) (b) of "The Education Department Act", being chapter 56 of the Revised Statutes of Manitoba, 1940, is as follows:


17. (1) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained the board shall have power . . . to prescribe and regulate the patriotic exercises to be used in schools;

THEREFORE the Advisory Board prescribes and regulates the following patriotic exercises to be used in schools on, from and after the Twentieth day of August, A.D. 1940:

- (a) "O Canada" shall be sung each day at the opening of school and "God Save the King" each day at the close of school, with pupils standing at attention erect.
- (b) Empire Day, the King's Birthday, Dominion Day, Armistice Day, shall be marked by suitable exercises in all the schools to impress upon the pupils love for and devotion to Canada and the Empire; such exercises may consist of suitable readings, recitations, songs, addresses, saluting the flag, and pageants of a patriotic character.
- (c) Every pupil, as instructed by the teacher, shall carry out and join in patriotic exercises which the teacher is conducting.
- (d) No pupil shall disrupt or show disrespect for any patriotic exercises which the teacher is conducting.
- (e) While the National Anthems—"O Canada" and "God Save the King"—are being sung, no pupil shall be excused from standing at attention erect.
- (f) No pupil shall under any circumstances be excused from standing at attention erect while patriotic exercises are being conducted by the teacher if the teacher directs all the pupils to stand to attention erect.

The form of patriotic exercises prescribed by this Board on the Twenty-fifth day of August, A.D. 1937, and the use in schools of the patriotic exercises regulated by this Board on the Twenty-third day of September, A.D. 1938, are hereby terminated as at the Twentieth day of August, A.D. 1940.




