Charmaine, born April 14, 1946, attended Winnipeg Beach and Gimli schools and graduated in 1967. She married Martin Lofgren October 13, 1979. They reside in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan. They have two daughters, Serena and Meghan.

Glenn, born April 10, 1949, attended school in Winnipeg Beach and Gimli. He married Susan Gotfried August 19, 1972. Glenn drowned accidentally June 30, 1974.

Zmavc, Jozef and Vida

Jozef Zmavc was born in Ljubno, Slovenija January 17, 1940. Jozef was raised in Ljubno where he attended public school and graduated from grade eight, which was the highest attainable grade. In 1954, Jozef then pursued an apprenticeship in carpentry and cabinet making and graduated with Journeyman papers in 1957. Jozef was employed with General Manufacturing Woodwork Company, a cabinet-making facility, until his departure from Ljubno, Slovenija in 1958.

After his departure from Slovenija, Jozef resided in Austria for one year. Austria was only an interim home and there Jozef worked as a journeyman until he immigrated to Canada in May 1959. He had always planned to immigrate to Canada, to be reunited with his older sister Olga Tisic. Olga was living in Winnipeg with her family since her departure from Slovenija three years prior. Olga moved to Vancouver in 1963 with her family and died in 1992 after succumbing to a terminal illness. In 1961, Jozef's younger brother Franc joined Olga and Jozef in Winnipeg, subsequently married and presently lives in Castlegar, British Columbia with his wife and two adult children. In 1963, Maria, Jozef's younger twin sister, was next to immigrate. Maria married and moved to St. Catherine's, Ontario, where she currently lives with her husband and their two adult children. Remaining in Slovenija are Jozef's brother Rudi and sister Neza. Jozef's parents, Jozef Sr. and Josephine, lived and died in Ljubno. Josephine died in 1978 at the age of sixty-one from complications of the heart and her husband Jozef Sr. died in 1986 at the age of seventy-eight of natural causes.

Upon arrival in Winnipeg, Jozef started his

employment career in Canada in a furniture factory until 1962, when he then pursued his career in the construction business. By 1964 he commenced his self-employment career as a general contractor and specialized in custom woodwork, which he continues to do until the present.

On December 2, 1961 Jozef married Vida Gorjanec in a Winnipeg church. They were married Roman Catholic in Our Lady of Fatima Catholic Church by Father Celustka. Both Jozef and Vida continue to practice their catholic faith and have been active in their parish, Our Lady of Lords Roman Catholic Slovenian Church, since its inception in 1963. Vida and Jozef lived in Winnipeg with their nine-month-old son Robert, until their relocation to St. Andrews in 1965.

Vida Gorjanec was born in Gorenji Suhadol-Novo Mesto, Slovenija, on January 2, 1942. Vida was raised in Gorenji Suhadol-Novo Mesto. After attending grade school in the local area, Vida had then attended boarding school for one year to qualify for trade school in Smihel-Novo Mesto. Although arrangements were made for Vida to commence trade school in the seamstress program in September 1958, Vida unexpectedly departed in August of that year and then fled to Austria. She remained in Austria for approximately four months before immigrating to Canada along with her sister and her brother-in-law in the fall of 1959.

Vida has four other siblings all of who remain in Slovenija. Her oldest sister Neza and oldest brother Slavko live in Ljubljana, Slovenija with their families. Vida's youngest sister Fanika lives in Vel. Brusnice, Novo Mesto, and her youngest brother Ivan lives in Cesca Vas, Novo Mesto with their families. Both of Vida's parents, Neza and Janez lived and died in Gorenji Suhadol-Novo Mesto. Neza died in 1974 at the age of sixty-five, and her husband, Janez, died in 1980 at the age of seventy-five.

Upon arrival in Winnipeg, Vida began her working career on Flora Avenue in a glove manufacturing company. She was employed with this company for a short period of time until she found other employment on Princess Avenue in a 'ladies' handbag factory. From 1959 to 1964, Vida then worked at United Garments Ltd., 326 Main Street, as a sewing machine operator. Vida quit her job in order to raise her family. During this time Vida also helped Jozef with the family company as his partner in the business and she continues to be involved with the company today.

Vida and Jozef have three children. The eldest child, Robert, was born November 16, 1964. He graduated from Lord Selkirk Regional Comprehensive Secondary School with honours in

1982 with a double major in drafting and science. He obtained his Bachelor of Science (Civil Engineering) from the University of Manitoba in 1986 and in 1991 obtained his Master of Science (Structural Engineering) from the University of Manitoba. Robert completed his research and thesis for his Master of Science in Edmonton where he resided from 1990 to 1992. Nicole Vickers, a local Clandeboye girl who is studying music at the University of Brandon entertained the crowd with songs and music; the Clandeboye Cloggers then showed us some fancy step dancing; Randall Weslak, the 1999 Manitoba Fiddling Champion from Elma, Manitoba played fiddle tunes, and Jim and Dorothy Long of Clandeboye, who also perform with Simpson's Folly, played traditional Celtic music.

This was followed by a pot luck Roast Beef Supper that was attended by well over 250 people. Following supper the crowd was entertained by magician Cary Tardi, of Winnipeg, who is the grandson of Clandeboye's own Bill Brace, Canada's greatest magician. He was followed by native hoop dancer, Melvin Starr, of Winnipeg. It was a real hon-

our to have him entertain for us as he is famous for his hoop dance, having danced for the Queen of England at Buckingham Palace. Dancing then commenced with the music of Matao Sound and Light. The age group of this crowd was 11 months to 78 years of age. At 10:00 p.m. the Community Club committee had all the children re-enact the New Years Celebration with noise makers, balloons, and the singing of "Auld Lang Syne", then they were taken outside to see the fireworks, again set off by the Clandeboye Fire Department. This event was a great success.

On January 2, 2000, at 12 noon, the day started with a Pancake Breakfast of pancakes, sausages and coffee which was sponsored by the Clandeboye United Church and St. George's Wakefield Anglican Church. At the closing ceremonies Simpson's Folly entertained the audience. They played to the children in the crowd and had them participate by way of using puppets and rhythm instruments. It was great to see how the children responded to this entertainment.

These Young Ambassadors will gather in the year 2050 and host another celebration, at which time this Capsule will be opened. The final events of the day were the fundraising draws on the Rainbow Auction and Raffle draw.

For the Rainbow Auction, prizes were donated

by local Clandeboye business people and tickets were sold at 3 for \$1.00. A ticket with your name was then placed in a can beside the prize that you wanted to win, then a name was pulled from this can to select the winner. For the Raffle Draw the prizes were a lovely homemade quilt, designed and quilted by the Clandeboye Quilters, three stuffed Polar Bears crafted and donated by Pat Hall of Wavey Creek Bears of Petersfield, and a lovely cross-stitched picture, hand stitched and donated by Muriel Haddad.

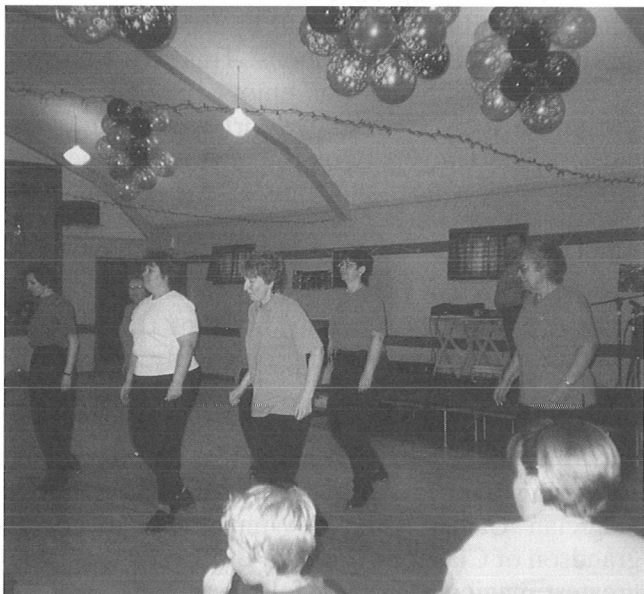

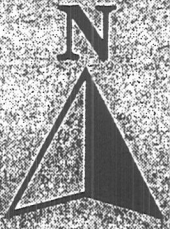

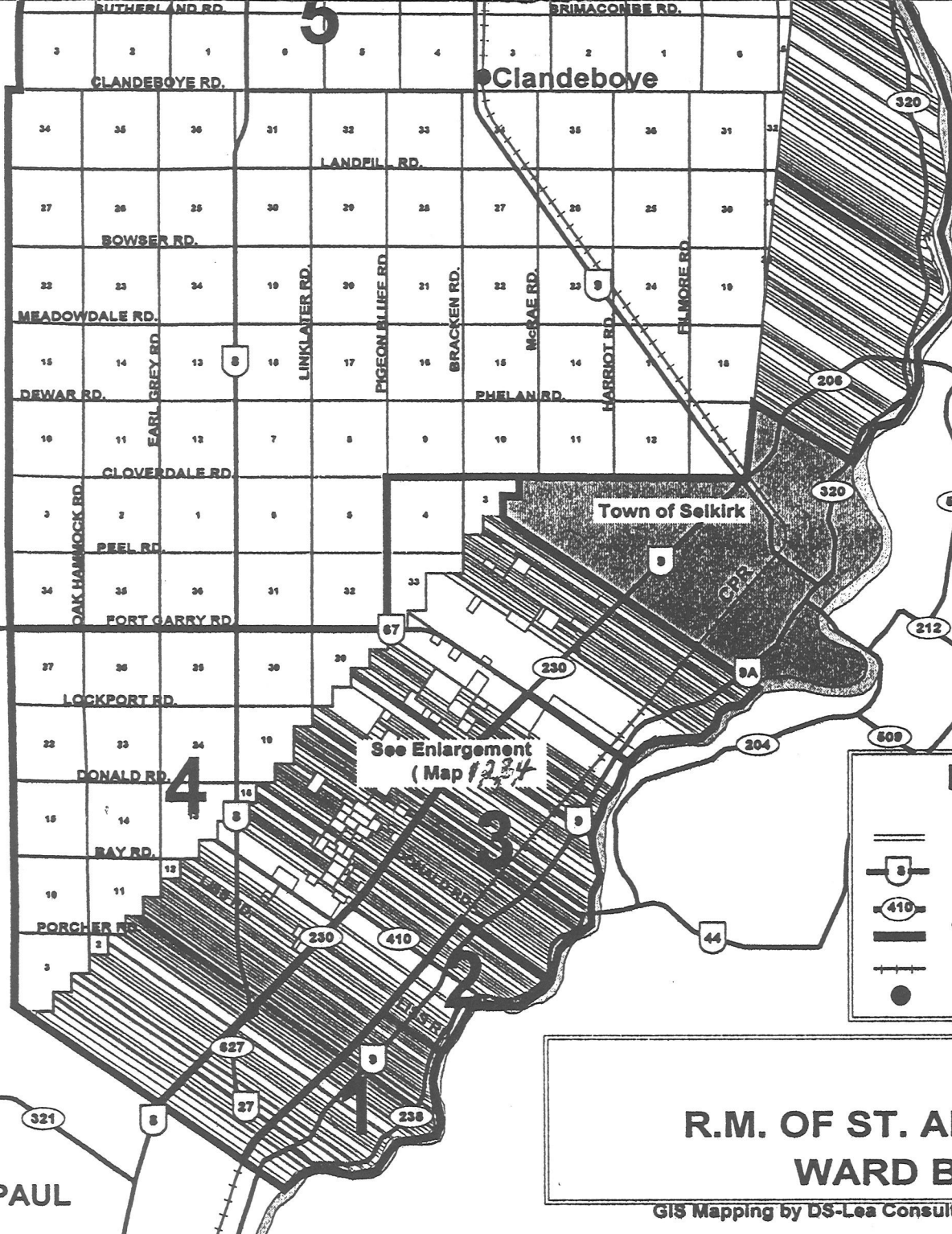
